STORYLINES

Two of the top teams in the MAC will meet in a crucial divisional matchup on Saturday evening when the Bulls visit the Zips. The Bulls have won three in a row, while Akron is looking to get back into the win column after a loss on Wednesday night.

UB is 15-6 on the season and 6-3 in MAC play following an 82-78 win at Ball State. The Bulls are led by **Justin Moss**, who leads the Bulls and the MAC at 18.2 points per game and 9.4 rebounds per contest. Sophomore **Shannon Evans** is coming off a 25-point game in his last outing and he averages 15.4 points per game. The Bulls have seven players averaging at least 6.0 points per game.

Akron had a three-game winning streak snapped at Ohio Wednesday night, 83-82. The Zips are led by big man Pat Forsythe, who is averaging 10.8 points and 5.5 rebounds per game. Deiji Ibitayo is second on the team at 10.1 points per contest and Noah Robotham adds 9.7 points per game.

Akron leads the all-time series, 27-23, as the two teams split their meetings last year, both winning at home. UB is looking for its first win at Akron since the 2011-12 season. The Bulls have won the last five meetings at Alumni Arena.

- Junior **Justin Moss** is scoring 14.4 more points per game this year than last, which is the largest difference in the country.
- The Bulls are one of five teams currently leading the conference with a 6-3 record. They join Akron, Bowling Green, Kent State, and Toledo.
- **Shannon Evans** recorded his seventh 20-point game of the season on Wednesday night. In all, the Bulls have had 18 20-point games this year, led by nine from **Justin Moss**.
- The Bulls have scored at least 70 points in six of their last seven games, winning five of those. UB is 7-0 when it scores over 80 points in a game.
- For the second time this year, UB has scored at least 80 points in back-to-back games.



Entering its second year, the New York Bulls Initiative (#NYBI) continues to broaden the awareness of The State University of New York, Buffalo athletics in an effort to build America's next big time college athletics brand.

initiative will position The State University of New York, Buffalo as the premier athletic department in the state.

Bulls Athletics has seen immediate returns as they have announced several new exciting strategic media partnerships, including deals with ESPN3 to broadcast all basketball and football games and ESPN Radio 1520, 50,000 watt powerhouse. In addition, the athletics department continues to enhance the tailgate experience with a free concert series from major recording stars. As a result, UB led the Mid-American Conference in football attendance last season. Strategic efforts are underway to galvanize the UB alumni base, and the Western New York community, to bring a vibrant college athletics atmosphere to campus.

Danny White, University at Buffalo Director of Athletics, joined by Pete Augustine, President of New Era, announced the launch of NYBI in 2013 and the formation of a volunteer Board of Advisors to provide strategic guidance to the Bulls Athletics leadership team.

Moss Is The Boss

Junior **Justin Moss** gave the Bulls valuable minutes off the bench last season, averaging 3.8 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. This season, he has been arguably the best player in the Mid-American Conference and he was most recently added to the Lou Henson Mid-Season Watch List, awarded to the nation's top Mid-Major player in the country. Picking up his first career start in the season opener vs. South Dakota State, Moss obliterated his career highs with 25 points and 13 rebounds, despite foul trouble. Moss went a perfect 11-of-11 from the free throw line as well. Moss also added two blocked shots.

Moss added eight points and six rebounds against top-ranked Kentucky, including a huge dunk on a Kentucky defender. For his efforts during the opening weekend, Moss was named the MAC East Player of the Week for the first time in his career.

His career-high was short lived however, as he scored 26 points in a win at Grand Canyon, scoring 18 of his points in the second half. He recorded his second career double-double in the win over Canisius as he finished with 18 points and 12 rebounds, earning himself Big 4 Player of the Week honors. Moss had a career-high 14 rebounds at St. Bonaventure. Moss added 20 points and 11 rebounds against Robert Morris, surpassing his scoring total from a year ago just seven games into the year. He added his second straight double-double against Drexel and had a strong second half for a third straight double-double against Niagara with 24 points and 11 rebounds. Moss became the first UB player since Javon McCrea last season to record four straight double-doubles as he had 14 points and 12 rebounds at Wisconsin. Moss recorded 23 points and 12 rebounds at Miami (OH) and he picked up his league-leading eighth double-double with 23 points and 11 rebounds against Western Michigan. Moss shattered all of his career-high totals on Saturday again Miami (OH) as he finished with 31 points and 15 rebounds becoming the first player in the country this year with 30 points and 15 rebounds in a single game against a Division I opponent. For the second time this year, Moss was named MAC East Player of the Week after the wins over NIU and Miami. In two games against Miami he averaged 27.0 points and 13.5 rebounds. Moss added a game-high 26 points against Central Michigan as he shot 11-of-15 from the floor. The 11 made field goals were a career high. He tied his career high in field goals just two games later as he had 23 points on 11-of-18 shooting against Western Michigan. He leads the MAC in scoring (18.2) and rebounding (9.4). In conference games only, Moss is averaging 20.6 points and has scored over 20 points in half of the nine games. He also leads the conference in rebounds in conference play, averaging 9.4. Moss has the highest improvement in scoring from one season to the next in the nation, averaging 14.4 more ppg than last year. Moss has demolished his numbers from last season, his first in a UB uniform:

It's Crowded At The Top

With half of the conference season in the books, the race for the regular season title and the conference tournament byes may come down to the very last game. With nine games already having been played, UB is tied with four other teams for the top record in the conference at 6-3. The Bulls join Akron, Bowling Green, Kent State, and Toledo with the 6-3 mark. The Bulls will have a chance for some separation as their next two games come at Akron and then next Tuesday at home against Toledo.

Built Ford Tough

Senior **Xavier Ford** is in his final season in a UB uniform, the only four-year member of this year's team. Ford had a breakout season for the Bulls last year as he played in all 29 games, while starting 17 of those contests. Last year, Ford set career highs in every statistic: points, rebounds, blocks, and steals. Ford showed his biggest improvement from the free throw line where he shot 74.4% last year after failing to crack the 50% mark in each of his first two years. As good as last year was, Ford is on pace to break all of those numbers this season and should get serious consideration as Sixth Man of the Year. Ford had a solid game off the bench for the Bulls in the opener with eight points and tying his career-high with nine rebounds. Ford led the Bulls in rebounding against Texas-Arlington. He had a career-best four assists against Grand Canyon, all coming on perfect feeds into the post for easy **Justin Moss** layups. On the defensive end, Ford set a new career high with four blocked shots against Canisius. After missing two games due to injury, Ford returned against Drexel and recorded 12 points and six rebounds off the bench in 17 minutes of action. He continued to be solid against Niagara as he recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in 24 minutes off the bench. Ford had nine points and eight rebounds in the first half, providing a spark for the Bulls early. The 13 rebounds were a career-high for Ford. Ford had four straight game in double figures, becoming the first player with four straight games in double figures off the bench since Andy Robinson did it during the 2008-09 season. He set a new career-high with 17 points in UB's MAC opening win at Miami (OH) as shot 7-of-9 from the field and had six boards. Ford had six points and eight rebounds in 20 minutes off the bench against Northern Illinois. He provided another spark in the win over Miami (OH) at Alumni Arena with 13 points and eight rebounds. In two games against Miami, Ford averaged 15.0 points per game. Ford had 11 points off the bench against Ohio. Ford broke into the starting lineup against Western Michigan and answered the call with 16 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and four steals. Through the first 19 games, Ford had already set a career-high in points for a season. However, he saved his best performance for national TV as he scored a career-high 25 points against Kent State on Friday night, including three 3-pointers. Ford was named MAC East Player of the Week for the first time in his career following the outstanding week. In MAC games only, Ford is averaging 11.1 points per game and 5.6 rebounds per contest.

Evans Completed Historic Week To End Non-Conference

Sophomore **Shannon Evans** recorded 14 points, 10 rebounds, and 10 assists in the win over Binghamton, the first triple-double in school history. Evans, who was looking for his first career double-double entering the evening, recorded career highs in rebounds and assists.

Evans became the sixth different player in the nation this season to record a triple double and he became the first Mid-American Conference player to have a triple double since Ohio's D.J. Cooper in the 2011-12 season. It was also the first triple-double amongst players in the Big 4 since Niagara's Anthony Nelson also during the 2011-12 season.

Not to be outdone, Evans then dropped a career-high 33 points in UB's victory over Cornell in their non-conference finale, scoring 11 points over the final four and a half minutes of the first half and adding 22 in the second half. Evans drained a career-high eight three pointers, the third highest total in school history. The eight three pointers are the most by a MAC player this season, while his 33 points are the second most by a player.

Nicknamed Hollywood, Evans has a flare for the dramatic, making some of the best and most unpredictable passes on the floor. Evans recorded 95 assists last season, to just 60 turnovers, including a career-high eight assists in a win over Miami (OH). He has also shown his ability to score, averaging 8.5 points per game. Evans showed his scoring touch in the win over South Dakota State, as he finished with 17 points in the season opener. He added two assists and three steals, while sinking two big free throws late in the win. He recorded 24 points in the win at Texas-Arlington as he went 7-of-14 from the field and 8-of-9 from the free throw line. He also led the Bulls with five assists. Evans had his second straight 20-point game against Grand Canyon as he finished 23 points, hitting a career-best four three pointers. Evans also added a season-best seven assists and six rebounds. Evans had his third 20-point game in the last four contests with 21 points against St. Bonaventure, scoring 18 of those points in the second half. Evans became the first UB guard since Rodney Pierce in 2008-09 to have three 20-point games over the team's first six games. In the win over Robert Morris, Evans controlled the pace of play, seeing 37 minutes of action, scoring 14 points, while adding three rebounds, six assists and four steals. Evans tied his previous career-high with eight assists in UB's win over Drexel and finished with eight more assists in the win against Niagara,

in addition to 20 points. He recorded at least six assists in seven of the first 13 games, including four in a row prior to Wisconsin. Evans added 12 points and four rebounds in the win over Kent State, hitting two big three pointers. Evans paced the Bulls with 25 points in the win over Ball State, the seventh time he has gone over 20 points this year. He is fifth in the league in scoring (15.4) and third in assists (4.5).

Home Improvement

Since **Bobby Hurley** took over the program prior to last season, the Bulls have been nearly perfect at home, winning 21 of 22 games. Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Bulls are 57-13 in Alumni Arena and going back even further, the Bulls are 122-43 at home since the 2003-04 season.

UB has won 19 straight home games against MAC West opponents with their last loss to the West occurring against Western Michigan on Feb. 1, 2010. UB is currently one of 29 teams undefeated at home this season.

The Best Things In Life Are Free

One of the keys to UB's success this season has been their ability to get to the free throw line. So far this year, the Bulls are 377-of-516 from the free throw line. UB is shooting .731 from the line, which is second in the MAC. Their 377 made free throws are 19th nationally. In conference games only, the Bulls are 163-of-255 from the free throw line. UB is 11-1 this season when it attempts at least 25 free throws in a game and 4-5 when they have under 25 attempts.

Shannon Evans and freshman **Lamonte Bearden**, who each had eight assists in the game. It was the first time that UB had two players with eight or more assists in the same game since Feb. 27, 1995 when Modie Cox (12) and Mike Martinho (8) did it in a 110-98 win over Eastern Illinois. Evans and Bearden followed up the performance by adding 15 combined assists in the win over Niagara as Evans had eight for the second straight game and Bearden added seven. In the two games against Binghamton and Cornell, both Evans and Bearden found double figures in assists for the first time as Evans had 10 assists at Binghamton and Bearden recorded 10 dimes against Cornell. Over the last seven home games (Drexel, Niagara, Cornell, NIU, Miami, WMU, Kent St.), Bearden and Evans have combined for 84 assists and just 29 turnovers. In the win over Western Michigan, the Bulls finished with a season-high 21 assists, while adding 18 more assists against Kent State. During the two games last week, Evans and Bearden were joined by junior **Jarryn Skeete**, to recorded 25 assists and just seven combined turnovers. Evans is third in the MAC in assists, while Bearden is fifth. UB and Central Michigan make up four of the top five assist leaders in the MAC. In conference games only, Bearden leads the MAC in assist to turnover ratio.

20/20

The Bulls had multiple players finish with more than 20 points in the win over Grand Canyon. Junior **Justin Moss** finished with a career-high 26 points, while sophomore **Shannon Evans** finished with 23 points. Evans was the star of the first half as he had 18 of his points in the first half, while Moss was the star of the second half as he had 18 points after the break. The Bulls accomplished that feat for the second time this season when Moss and Evans both went over 20 points in the win over Niagara. Evans and Moss achieved the feat for a third time as they each finished with 23 points against Western Michigan. It was the first time since the 2011-12 season that UB had two players scored 20 points in multiple games in the same season. Mitchell Watt and Javon McCrea did it during the 2011-12 season against Youngstown State and Temple. Overall, UB has had 18 20-point performances this season, led by nine from Moss and seven from Evans. **Lamonte Bearden** and **Xavier Ford** each have one.

I Love The 90's

UB scored a season-high 92 points against Cornell in its final non-conference game, its highest point total of the season. The 92 points are the most scored by the Bulls since they put up 96 last year in a win over Akron. It was the fourth straight year that the Bulls have put up at least 90 points in a game at Alumni Arena.

National Attention

The Bulls have played arguably the two toughest non-conference opponents in the Mid-American Conference this season as they faced top-ranked Kentucky in early November and then Wisconsin, who was ranked sixth nationally when the teams played. The Bulls took halftime leads on both opponents and the 38-33 lead that UB had at Kentucky remains the largest deficit that UK has had at the half all season and is tied for the most point they have allowed in a first half this year. The Bulls also led at the 13 minute mark, the latest Kentucky trailed in a non-conference game this year. Against Wisconsin, UB led 27-26, just one of two teams to hold a halftime lead on the Badgers with the other being #2 Duke.

Oh, Canada!

Junior **Jarryn Skeete**, who joins Wigginton as a Canadian native, begins his junior season after suffering through some injuries last season during his sophomore campaign. Skeete is one of the most dynamic three point shooters on the Bulls and he has made 63 three pointers over his first two seasons in a UB uniform. Last season, Skeete tied a career-high with 19 points as hit four three pointers in a win over Eastern Michigan in January. Skeete was also one of the top free throw shooters for the Bulls last season as he went 26-for-30 from the line.

After scoring just four points in the opener, Skeete has had two big games, beginning #1 Kentucky. Skeete hit a three for UB's first points and finished with a game-high 16 points, including 4-for-6 from three point range. He added 13 points against Texas-Arlington, with nine of those coming in the second half. He added 14 points against Grand Canyon, going 3-of-4 from three point range. Skeete hit four three pointers in the win over Drexel and then set a new career high as he drained five triples in the win over Niagara, going 5-for-8 from behind the arc and setting a season-high with 17 points. Skeete is now 25-of-52 from three-point range this year to lead the Bulls. Skeete returned to the lineup against Western Michigan for the first time since Dec. 19 after missing four games due to an ankle injury. Skeete returned to the starting lineup against Northern Illinois and finished with 14 points, including three straight threes in the first half to ignite the UB offense. Skeete scored 15 points in the first half against Central Michigan, draining four three pointers. He is now 38-of-98 from three point range (38.8%).

Road Warriors

The Bulls played six straight games on the road following their season opener this year, traveling over 7,800 miles after hosting South Dakota State in the home opener on Nov. 14. UB went 4-2 on the road trip with its only losses coming at top-ranked and undefeated Kentucky and

one-loss St. Bonaventure. The Bulls, who played just four non-conference home games went 1-1 on their previous road trip following the victory at Binghamton. The Bulls have seven true road wins as they played 13 of their first 21 games away from home. The 13 road games played by the Bulls are the most in the nation amongst schools in the RPI Top 50. UB has played three more road games than any other school in the MAC.

Re-Freshing

Freshman **Lamonte Bearden** became the first UB freshman to start the season opener for the Bulls since the 2005-06 and he didn't disappoint, dishing out six assists in his first collegiate action. More importantly, Bearden was credited with just one turnover in the game. He also added eight points, two rebounds and a steal. Bearden had another eight points in UB's game at nationally-ranked Kentucky, while also leading the team in assists. Bearden recorded eight points in each of the first four games this season before exploding for 23 points on 9-of-13 shooting in the win over Canisius. The 23 points were the most scored by a UB freshman since Javon McCrea had 29 at Iona on March 22, 2011 and it is the most by a UB guard since Calvin Cage scored 24 points at Northwestern on December 30, 2002. Bearden recorded a career-high eight assists in UB's win over Drexel, while adding 11 points and six rebounds. He added seven more assists in the win over Niagara. In his homecoming at Wisconsin, Bearden finished with 13 points and three assists. Defensively, Bearden had a career-high four steals against Binghamton. Bearden finished with 10 assists in the win over Cornell, the first time a UB freshman finished in double figures since current teammate **Jarryn Skeete** had 10 vs. Manhattan back in 2013. Bearden had 11 points and six assists in the win over Northern Illinois and added seven assists against Miami. Bearden finished the home week with 13 assists and just three turnovers. Bearden had seven points, four rebounds, seven assists and a career-high five steals in the win over Ball State. Bearden leads the MAC in assist to turnover ratio in conference play.

Getting Wiggy With It

Junior **Rodell Wigginton** had one of his best games in his brief Buffalo career against top ranked Kentucky as he had 15 points in 26 minutes of action. Wigginton did most of his damage from the free throw line where he went 9-for-11. Wigginton is playing his first season with UB after transferring from the College of Central Florida. Wigginton recorded six rebounds off the bench in the win over Grand Canyon. Wigginton scored 12 points on 5-of-9 shooting in the win against Canisius at the First Niagara Center and he also finished with seven rebounds. Wigginton added 12 points against Drexel, including a huge ally-oop dunk. Wigginton picked up his first career start at nationally-ranked Wisconsin and had five rebounds in the contest. He picked up his second career start against Binghamton, recording his first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. After starting five straight games, Wigginton returned to the bench against Northern Illinois, but had a big game on both ends of the floor with 12 points, six rebounds and three steals. Despite foul trouble, Wigginton had nine points and five rebounds in just 15 minutes in the win over Ball State.

Raheem The Dream

The Bulls have gotten solid minutes off the bench from junior **Raheem Johnson**, who played his first two seasons at Barton Community College. He scored three points against #1 Kentucky, but most of his effect has been shown on the defensive end where he has recorded some big rebounds and blocked shots. Against South Dakota St. Johnson had three blocked shots, while adding four points and four rebounds in the win against Canisius. Johnson finished with eight points against St. Bonaventure and had a career-high 10 points at Ohio, scoring all of them in the second half. He went 5-of-6 from the floor and pulled down five boards in just 14 minutes. He added a career-high four blocked shots in the win over Kent State. Over his last four games, Johnson is averaging 7.8 points per game. Johnson is currently seventh in the MAC in blocked shots, averaging 1.2 blocks per game. In league games only, he is tied for fifth in blocks.

Will Power

Senior **Will Regan** is Buffalo's returning leading scorer and rebounder for the Bulls. Regan was named preseason All-MAC as well as to the preseason All-Big 4 First Team.

Regan finished with 15 points and six rebounds in the win over Texas-Arlington. He had a stretch against the Mavericks where he scored seven straight points for the Bulls. Regan is had back-to-back games in double figures as he scored 10 points against St. Bonaventure and then had 12 points in the win at Robert Morris, going 5-for-9 from the field, including hitting both three pointers. Regan had 14 points against Binghamton. Regan had 13 points and nine rebounds in the win over Miami (OH), converting on a huge four-point play in the final two minutes of action. Regan added seven points against Central Michigan. Regan came off the bench against Western Michigan to add five points, going over 800 points for his Buffalo career.

BOBBY HURLEY

HEAD COACH • SECOND YEAR AT BUFFALO • DUKE '93

Bobby Hurley, one of the most iconic figures in college basketball history, begins his second season as head coach of the UB men's basketball team. Hurley led the Bulls to their first ever outright MAC East Division title in 2013-14.

Hurley was named a finalist for the Joe B. Hall Awards, which is given to the nation's top first year head coach. He coach Javon McCrea, who was named the MAC Player of the Year and became UB's all-time leading scorer during his senior season. The Bulls won 19 games in Hurley's first year at the helm.

Hurley was named the 12th head men's basketball coach at the University at Buffalo. He joined UB from the University of Rhode Island where he has been serving as associate head coach.

"After reviewing a large and highly qualified national pool and following my conversations with some of the most respected figures in college athletics, Coach Hurley was clearly the choice to lead the next era of UB basketball," White said. "As we continue to foster our role as the flagship athletic department for the state of New York, the appointment of Coach Hurley sends a clear statement that the University at Buffalo is committed to bringing big time college athletics to the Western New York community and the state at large.

"Coach Hurley adds an exciting dynamic to our athletic program," White added. "He is one of the most accomplished players in college basketball history with a legacy that includes three Final Four appearances and winning two national championships. I'm confident, after our discussions, that he is the right leader to take our program to the next level. We couldn't be more proud to welcome Bobby, Leslie and their family to the Western New York community."

A first-team All-American in 1993, Hurley is best remembered for being the point guard at Duke – one of the best college basketball teams of all time. Along with Western New York native Christian Laettner, Hurley led the Blue Devils to three Final Four appearances and consecutive national championships in 1991 and 1992. Hurley still holds the NCAA record for career assists with 1,076.

Following his outstanding career at Duke, Hurley was selected by the Sacramento Kings with the seventh pick in the 1993 NBA Draft. He went on to play five years in the NBA with the Kings and Vancouver Grizzlies.

Hurley joined the Philadelphia 76ers as a scout in 2003 before venturing into private business. He was hired as an assistant coach at Wagner College in 2010 and spent two seasons with the Seahawks, playing a critical role in rebuilding the men's basketball team. He helped lead Wagner to a 25-6 record during the 2011-12 season – its best record in school history – before joining Rhode Island, where he was associate head coach this past season.

Hurley comes from a strong basketball lineage. His father, Bob, Sr., is a legendary coach in the high school ranks, leading perennial power St. Anthony's to 26 state championships and more than 1,000 wins in 39 years of coaching. He was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010. Hurley's brother, Dan, is the head men's basketball coach at Rhode Island, after a successful tenure at Wagner College and an outstanding prep school coaching career.

Hurley and his wife, Leslie, have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney, and a son, Bobby.

BUFFALO, NY - The State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team began its 2014-15 season on Thursday night, defeating Wheeling Jesuit 79-60 in an exhibition contest at Alumni Arena. The Bulls received balanced scoring as four players found their way into double figures and seven different players saw at least 20 minutes of court time.

With seven new faces on the team this year, the Bulls were able to maintain a lead for nearly the entire evening. Freshman Lamonte Bearden got the night started by tipping in his own miss for the first points of the game. Wheeling Jesuit took its only lead of the contest at 4-2, but senior Xavier Ford answered as he hit a three-pointer, the first one that he has taken in his career. The game was tied up at 5-5, when the Bulls went on a quick 6-0 run with the final four points coming from senior Will Regan.

A three pointer from freshman Mory Diane gave the Bulls their first double-digit lead of the night at 31-21 with 6:48 remaining and the Bulls went on to lead by as many as 11 in the opening half before taking a 42-33 lead into the half.

The Bulls opened the second half on a 9-0 run, getting four of those points from the free throw line from Ford. Another three pointer from Diane put UB ahead 59-40 with 14:06 remaining and the Bulls kept their double-digit lead through out the second half.

The Cardinals pulled within 11 twice in the second half as the Bulls led 61-50 with 9:18 remaining. The Bulls went on a 13-4 run over the next five and a half minutes to extend their lead to 74-54 with just 3:30 left. A jumper from Diane with 1:16 left gave the Bulls their largest lead of the game at 22 before a final three pointer from Wheeling Jesuit made the score 79-60, which was the final.

Regan led all scorers with 16 points as he was extremely efficient from the field, going 4-of-5, including 3-of-4 from three point range. Regan also hit five out of six free throws and hauled in eight rebounds. Evans added 14 points and a game-high six assists, while Diane also added 14 points in his college debut, including hitting four three-pointers. Ford had 12 points, including 7-of-10 from the free throw line and four steals.

Bearden picked up the start and added six points, four assists and two steals, while junior Jarryn Skeete added six points on a pair of three-pointers. Junior Raehem Johnson saw 22 minutes off the bench and he had six points and a team-high nine rebounds. Fellow junior Rodell Wigginton added five points and two rebounds.

BUFFALO, NY - The State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team overcame a late deficit during the final minute of play, edging South Dakota State, 69-67, Friday night at Alumni Arena. It was the first time since the 2011-12 season that the Bulls won their season opener.

It was a back-and-forth night for the two teams who waited over 10 months for this contest after weather postponed the original date last January. Despite a tough shooting night for the Bulls, UB was able to take advantage in the rebounding column and at the free throw line for the victory.

The Bulls got out to an early five-point lead, the largest by either team in the first half. With such little separation between the sides, it was no surprise that it was just a one-point game at the half. Despite trailing 28-27 at the break, junior Justin Moss was already the standout for UB, recording 11 points and nine rebounds before the break.

South Dakota State built up an early eight-point lead in the second half as they took a 41-33 advantage with 14:46 left. Although the Bulls didn't have much success from behind the arc, UB got a huge three from sophomore Shannon Evans to end the run. However, UB still trailed 47-40 with just under 12 minutes left when the Bulls went on an 11-0 run over a four and a half minute stretch, capped off on a tip-in three point play from Moss.

UB built its lead to 56-50 with 6:33 left, but a SDSU three pointer pulled the Jackrabbits back within three. A fast break steal and dunk from Xavier Ford gave the Bulls a 65-61 lead with just under two minutes left, but South Dakota State scored the next five points to take a 66-65 lead with 1:06 remaining. The Bulls were able to find a wide open Jarryn Skeete, who drove to the lane and put UB up for good with 41 seconds left. Evans hit a couple free throws to give UB a 69-66 advantage and the Bulls smartly fouled with less than three seconds left to remove the possibility of a three-point play. SDSU sunk one free throw, but was unable to tie the game up as the Bulls came away with the win.

Moss finished with career highs of 25 points and 13 rebounds, while going a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line. His numbers could have been even higher, but Moss was limited by foul trouble before ultimately fouling out with 3:45 remaining.

Evans dropped 17 points as he picked up his first career start after coming off the bench in every game last season. He added two assists and three steals. Freshman Lamonte Bearden led all players with six assists, while he also added eight points and a steal.

LEXINGTON, KY - The State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team had its sight set on one of the biggest upsets in college basketball history on Sunday afternoon and through 20 minutes, it looked like it might come true. The Bulls held a 38-33 lead at the half against #1 ranked Kentucky before the Wildcats moved ahead in the second half for a 71-52 win at Rupp Arena in front of a nearly sold out crowd of 22,175.

The Bulls got out to a quick start to the game thanks to the shooting of junior Jarryn Skeete, who scored 14 of his 16 points in the opening half. Despite a noticeable size difference on the court, Kentucky was unable to grab more than a four point advantage. Trailing 25-23 in the first half, the Bulls went on a 7-0 run, which was capped off on a thunderous dunk from junior Justin Moss over a Kentucky defender.

Kentucky regained the lead 33-32 with 4:24 left, but the Bulls held the number one team off the scoreboard for the rest of the half and ended the half on a 6-0 run with the final three points coming from junior Rodell Wigginton.

However, in the second half Kentucky came out and showed why they have earned the number one ranking. The Wildcats opened the second half on a 9-0 run to take a 42-38 lead, but the Bulls answered back with five quick points coming on a jumper from freshman Lamonte Bearden and three free throws from Rodell Wigginton.

UB continued to lead with 14:23 remaining following a jumper from Skeete, which put the Bulls ahead 45-43, but then Kentucky took control for the final 14 minutes, ending the game on a 28-7 run.

"I was really proud of my team and how we competed, particularly in the first half," said second-year head coach Bobby Hurlley. "Obviously being able to have a halftime lead against this type of opponent was a big thing for us. Hopefully it is a confidence-building performance. Proud of winning the hustle game early in the first half with loose balls, charges, gritty play."

Skeete led all scorers with 16 points, shooting 4-of-6 from three point range. Wigginton added 15 points, doing most of his damage from the free throw line, where he was 9-for-11. Moss added eight points and six rebounds, while freshman Lamonte Bearden added eight points and three assists.

Defensively, the Bulls held all five Kentucky starters in single figures in scoring, with most of their damage coming from the bench, led by 12 points from Tyler Ulis and Trey Lyles.

The crowd of 22,175 was the largest that UB has ever played in front of.

ARLINGTON, TX - The State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team trailed for just over one minute total on Tuesday evening, leading nearly throughout in a 74-68 victory at Texas-Arlington. The victory improves UB to 2-1 on the season. The Bulls placed four in double figures led by a career-high 24 points from sophomore Shannon Evans.

The Bulls scored the first eight points of the evening with the final points coming from Evans, who went on to score the next eight points for the Bulls. UTA fought back and took its first lead of the contest at 13-12 with 12:33 remaining, but the Bulls answered with an 8-2 run. Quiet the first two games, senior Will Regan had a breakout night as he scored seven straight points for the Bulls during the run.

Arlington never led by more than one, which it did three times during the first half, the final time coming with 1:34 left before UB ended the half on a quick 5-0 run to take a 35-31 lead into the break.

The Bulls opened up a double-digit lead for the first time in this young season as reigning MAC East Player of the Week Justin Moss hit a layup with 9:11 left to give the Bulls a 57-47 advantage. The Mavericks cut it back to 57-52, but the Bulls answered with a 10-0 run, which featured three pointers from junior Jarryn Skeete as well as Evans, putting the Bulls ahead 67-52 with 4:32 left.

UTA tried to make a late rally, but never pulled any closer than six, thanks to some clutch free throw shooting as UB went 24-for-31 from the free throw line.

Evans went 7-of-14 from the floor and 8-of-9 from the free throw line as he finished with his career-best 24 points. Evans also added five assists and two steals. Regan had a season-best 15 points, hitting three treys and also going a perfect 4-of-4 from the free throw line. He added six rebounds, two blocks and two steals.

Skeete finished with nine of his 13 points in the second half, also recording six rebounds, while Moss added 11 points and six rebounds despite playing just six minutes in the first half due to foul trouble. Freshman Lamonte Bearden added eight points and a career-high seven rebounds.

Defensively, the Bulls held the Mavs to under 40% shooting as UTA put up 31 three-pointers, converting on nine of them. UB forced UTA into 16 turnovers and the Bulls outrebounded their competition, 44-38.

PHOENIX, AZ - Junior Justin Moss scored a career-best 26 points and sophomore Shannon Evans added 23 as the State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team defeated Grand Canyon, 80-64. The win improves the Bulls to 3-1 on the season.

Evans stole the show in the first half as he scored 18 of his points before the intermission, including four three pointers. Junior Jarryn Skeete knocked down 11 of his own in the first half as the Bulls shot nearly 60% from the floor. The host Antelopes led in the game just once for 22 seconds at 8-7 when the Bulls answered with a 10-0 run, all coming via Evans. Grand Canyon pulled back within two, but back-to-back three balls from Skeete and Evans put UB back up eight.

The Bulls would go on to lead by as many as 18 in the opening half as a layup from Moss put the Bulls ahead 43-25 with 2:19 left. A small run at the end of the half by GCU put the Bulls into the break ahead 45-32.

With the offensive success of Evans in the first half, that opened up the post and Moss took full advantage in the second half scoring 18 of his 26 points. In fact, Moss scored the first nine points of the second half for the Bulls. Both teams got into foul trouble early in the half, so much of the scoring was done at the free throw line.

The Antelopes cut the UB lead to 57-47 with 9:41 left when the Bulls went on an 11-0 run, capped off on a fast-break layup from freshman Lamonte Bearden to give the Bulls a 68-47 lead with 7:18 remaining. Grand Canyon pulled within 13 with 2:37 left, but got no closer.

For the first time this season and the first time since Feb. 19 of last year, the Bulls had two 20-point scorers. Moss added nine rebounds and two steals, while Evans had a season-high seven assists, while turning it over just once. He also finished with six rebounds and two steals.

Skeete added 14 points, while for the fourth straight game Bearden finished with eight points. All eight players that saw action tonight found the scoring column. Senior Will Regan had two points and six rebounds, as did junior Rodell Wigginton. Junior Raheem Johnson finished with three points, while senior Xavier Ford had two points, three rebounds and four assists, all going to Moss down low.

As a team, the Bulls shot 28-of-54 from the floor, setting season highs for both field goal percentage and field goals made. They also set season highs for 3pt field goal percentage, assists and steals.

BUFFALO, NY - The State University of New York, Buffalo men's basketball team led wire-to-wire on Saturday afternoon as the Bulls scored the first six points of the game and defeated Canisius, 72-57, at the Big 4 Basketball Classic downtown at the First Niagara Center. This is the third straight road win for the Bulls as they improve to 4-1 on the season.

OLEAN, NY - The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York men's basketball team outscored St. Bonaventure, 45-38 over the final 20 minutes, but was unable to overcome a slow start, falling to the host Bonnies, 72-63, Wednesday night at the Reilly Center. The loss snaps a three-game winning streak for the Bulls, who are now 4-2 on the season. St. Bonaventure improved to 5-1.

"I credit St. Bonaventure and how they came out to start the game tonight," said head coach Bobby Hurley. "We talked about getting out to a quick start, and we've done that the last few games, but tonight our offense was sluggish and out of synch on that end of the floor. Defensively, we had too many breakdowns and they hurt us in transition especially early and we let them get to the rim too easily as well, which really hasn't happened to us too many times this year."

Evans led all players tonight with 21 points and six assists. This was his third 20-point game of the season. The six assists are one short of his season-high. Regan added 10 points and six rebounds, while junior Justin Moss had eight points and a career-high 14 rebounds.

The Bulls led for nearly the entire game as the host Colonials had just one lead after scoring the first two points of the contest. UB responded by scoring the next seven, and never trailed again. RMU trailed 11-8 in the opening half when the Bulls went on a 12-2 run over the next four minutes to take a 23-10 lead. RMU hit a couple late shots to pull within 14 with the final margin of victory being 15.

The Bulls placed four in double figures, led by Moss, who had 20 points and 11 rebounds, his third double-double of the year. Evans had a nice all-around game with 14 points, three rebounds, five assists and four steals. 12 of his 14 points came in the second half.

Regan had his second straight game in double figures with 12 points, going 5-of-9 from the field, including a perfect 2-of-2 from three-point range. Skeete added 11 points, six rebounds and five assists, hitting three 3-pointers in the game.

The game was UB's first home contest in 33 days and the Bulls led for nearly the entire evening as they improve to 6-2 on the season.

After allowing the first points of the evening to go the way of the visitor, the Bulls quickly responded with a 14-2 run and never trailed again. The Bulls had five different players score points during the run, including a three-pointer from Jarryn Skeete, one of four that he hit on the night.

The Bulls continued to lead by 10 with 11:16 left in the opening half, but couldn't put away the Dragons early as Drexel went on an 18-9 run to pull within one with 4:18 left. However, the Bulls never relinquished the lead as a layup from senior Will Regan gave the Bulls a 38-32 lead at the break.

Drexel stayed within striking distance early in the second half, but the Bulls started to take control riding the momentum from an ally-oop from Skeete, which was finished off by junior Rodell Wigginton, giving the Bulls a 53-47 lead with 11:46 left. Drexel pulled within 53-49 when the Bulls went on an 8-0 run, all thanks to Skeete, who scored all the points, including back-to-back three pointers, both off feeds from freshman Lamonte Bearden.

The Bulls would get their lead up to as many as 14 points, which they did twice over the final 3:34 of action before ending with the 80-70 victory. The 80 points are tied for the most scored by the Bulls this season.

Junior Justin Moss picked up his second straight double-double as he had 16 points and 10 rebounds on the night. Moss came into tonight's game leading the MAC in both scoring and rebounding. Skeete added 14 points, while Wigginton and senior Xavier Ford both scored 12 points off the bench. Ford, who set a season-high in points tonight, had missed the last two games due to injury, but came back and added six rebounds and two steals in 17 minutes.

Bearden added 11 points, six rebounds and a career-high eight assists, while sophomore Shannon Evans matched Bearden's total with a career-best eight assists as well. He also added seven points, five rebounds and two steals. Regan fell just shy of double figures with eight points.

The Bulls set season-highs tonight in field goals made (31) and assists (19), while tying their season high for offensive rebounds with 16.

BUFFALO, NY - The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York men's basketball team shot a blistering 64.0% in the second half and led by as many as 33 points as the Bulls defeated Big 4 rival Niagara, 88-62, Friday night at Alumni Arena. The win improves the Bulls to 7-2 on the season, their best record since starting 11-1 in 2005-06.

Due to a Class B technical foul that was called on the Bulls prior to the start of the game, Niagara actually started the contest with a 1-0 lead before the opening tip. The Purple Eagles held on to the lead for the first three and a half minutes, but never had more than a one possession advantage. UB was down 5-2 when they went on a 9-0 run, capped off on a three pointer from Jarryn Skeete, giving the Bulls an 11-5 lead and they never looked back.

Niagara was able to keep it close in the opening half as they pulled it within two, 28-26, with 3:41 left, but the Bulls were able to end the half on a 10-2 run, including a huge three pointer from sophomore Shannon Evans as time expired in the half.

The Bulls came out of the break and absolutely dominated the second half scoring a season-high 50 points, shooting 16-of-25 from the floor for 64.0%. The 50 points scored in the second half are the most points scored by UB in a half since scoring 50 in the first half vs. Mansfield on Nov. 24, 2012.

UB opened the second half on an 11-2 run as it took a 49-30 lead just under four minutes into the half. Niagara pulled within 16 points at 63-47 with 9:40 left when the Bulls went on a 21-4 run over the next six and a half minutes. The highlight play in the run came on a behind the back pass from Evans to Justin Moss, who finished with a tomahawk slam. The 33-point lead by the Bulls was their largest lead of the season.

Moss picked up his third straight double-double with 24 points and 11 rebounds, doing most of his damage in the second half where he had 20 of those points and nine rebounds. Ford recorded his first career double-double as he finished with 11 points and 13 rebounds, as he had nine points and eight boards before the break. It was the first time that the Bulls had two players with a double-double in the same game since Feb. 23, 2013 vs. Manhattan.

Evans finished with 20 points and eight assists as he went 12-of-13 from the free throw line. It was the second straight game that Evans has recorded eight assists. Freshman Lamonte Bearden, who also had eight dimes on Tuesday night, added seven more this evening.

Skeete finished with a season-high 17 points, two shy of his career-high as he was deadly from behind the arc again, going 5-for-8 from long distance.

MADISON, WI - For the second time this season, the University at Buffalo, the State University of New York played one of the top teams in the nation, and for the second time the Bulls took a lead into the half before falling in the final 20 minutes. After facing top-ranked Kentucky a month and a half ago, the Bulls faced sixth-ranked Wisconsin on Sunday evening in front of a sold out crowd of 17,279 at the Kohl Center. The Bulls led the Badgers 27-26 at the half before falling, 68-56. The loss drops UB to 7-3 on the season, with two of those losses coming to nationally-ranked opponents.

The Bulls shot nearly 41% from the field in the opening half and led for 14 minutes in the first. The Badgers led 14-13 11 minutes into the game when the Bulls went on a 12-5 run to take their largest lead of the game at 25-19 with 4:55 left following a jumper from senior Xavier Ford. The Bulls continued to lead by six with 3:34 left, however Wisconsin scored the final five points of the half and cut the UB lead to one at the break.

A three-pointer from sophomore Shannon Evans gave the Bulls a 34-32 lead, but Wisconsin then went on a game-changing 14-0 run over the next four minutes to a take a 46-34 lead. The Badgers led by as many as 15 points, but the Bulls had no quit in them, trying to make one last run.

Wisconsin led 60-45 with 4:30 remaining, when UB went on an 11-4 run as a three-point play from Ford pulled the Bulls within eight at 64-56 with a minute remaining. Forced to foul, Wisconsin hit four straight free throws over the final minute for the 12 point win.

Junior Justin Moss finished with his fourth straight double-double as he had 14 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. It was the sixth straight game that Moss has recorded double figures in rebounds.

In his homecoming, freshman Lamonte Bearden finished with 13 points and three assists, while Evans added 12 points, hitting 3-of-5 from three-point range. Ford had another big night off the bench as he scored 11 points, his third straight game in double figures. Ford outscored the entire Wisconsin bench himself, 11-10.

Senior Will Regan added six points on a pair of three-pointers and four rebounds. Junior Rodell Wigginton picked up his first start of the season and added five rebounds.

BINGHAMTON, NY - Sophomore Shannon Evans finished with 14 points, 10 rebounds, and 10 assists on Tuesday night, recording the first triple-double in school history as the University at Buffalo, The State University of New York, defeated Binghamton, 76-50, in front of 3,534 fans at the Events Center. The Bulls are now 8-3 on the season heading into their final non-conference game.

The Bulls led throughout the night as they scored the first seven points and never looked back. The Bulls opened up a 21-5 lead just seven minutes into the game as they hit five early three pointers, including two from Evans and senior Will Regan. Junior Rodell Wigginton also hit a three en route to his first career double-double. A dunk from junior Justin Moss gave the Bulls their largest lead of the first half at 40-19 before taking a 19-point lead into the half.

In the first half alone, Evans had 13 points and six assists, but had just three rebounds heading into the second half.

The Bulls led by at least 20 points for the entire second half and while the result of the game was already decided, the storyline quickly turned to Evans, who coming into the game was looking for his first career double-double, let alone a triple-double. Evans recorded his eighth assist with 13 minutes left in the second half, but it took nearly eight minutes before he would record another, this one coming on a long jumper from Wigginton.

UB went into the final media timeout leading 66-40 and Evans, who already had double figures in points, had nine rebounds and nine assists. Out of the timeout, Evans gathered in a defensive rebound for his career-high 10 board and with 2:32 left Evans hit Regan, who drained a three, and recorded his 10th assist.

Moss hit a pair of free throw with a 1:57 left to give the Bulls their largest lead of the game at 74-43. Redshirt freshman Christian Pino scored his first career points as he hit a pair of free throws in the final minute.

Evans was one of five players in double figures with his 14 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists. He recorded just two turnovers. The triple double was the first one in the MAC this season and the seventh overall in the nation this year.

Moss led all scorers with 16 points, while Regan and Wigginton both joined Evans with 14 points. Regan did most of his damage from behind the arc with four three pointers, while Wigginton had 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds for his first career double-double. He hit his first two three pointers of the year as well.

Senior Xavier Ford finished with his fourth straight game in double figures off the bench as he had 11 points and four rebounds. Freshman Lamonte Bearden added four points, three assists and a game-high four steals.

BUFFALO, NY - Sophomore Shannon Evans completed quite the week on Saturday afternoon as he scored a career-high 33 points just one game after recording a triple-double. The career high helped lead the University at Buffalo, The State University of New York to a 92-73 win over Cornell, ending the Bulls non-conference schedule with a 9-3 record.

In the first half, the Bulls were able to withstand a hot shooting Cornell team, that went 50% from the floor, including 6-for-11 from three-point range. Despite UB's best efforts to stop each Big Red run, Cornell found itself with a 33-24 lead with just under five minutes to go in the first half, its largest lead of the game. However, Evans began to heat up over the final five minutes as he ignited a 17-6 run over the final 4:49, give the Bulls a 41-39 lead into the break. Evans had 11 of the 17 points, including a three from the corner just before the half ended. He had been scoreless up until that point.

Evans and the Bulls then took over in the second half, scoring a season-high 51 points over the final 20 minutes of play. UB went on a 22-10 run over the first seven and a half minutes of the half, getting four three pointers, including two from Evans. Senior Will Regan and junior Rodell Wigginton also hit from long range during the run. A baseline dunk from Evans with 8:19 remaining gave the Bulls a 76-57 lead.

Cornell was able to cut the deficit to 11 with 6:15 remaining, but Evans scored five straight, including another triple, to put the Bulls back up by 16, 81-65. Evans capped off his night with one final three pointer with 1:53 left to give the Bulls a 92-72 lead as he finished with 33 points.

The 33 points from Evans were the most by a UB player this season and the most since Javon McCrea had 34 points against Bowling Green last year. Evans went 9-of-14 from the floor, including 8-of-11 from behind the arc. The eight three pointers are tied for third most by a player in a single game. Josh Frelove had eight three pointers in a game last year. The Suffolk, VA native also went 7-of-8 from the free throw line and had four rebounds, five assists and a steal.

Freshman Lamonte Bearden recorded his first career double-double with 14 points and a career-high 10 assists, the second straight game that a UB player finished with 10 assists. Bearden went 5-for-9 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the free throw line. H also added three steals.

Wigginton picked up his third straight start and finished with 14 points, including several big dunks and two big three pointers. Junior Justin Moss had 11 points, his sixth straight game scoring in double figures.

KALAMAZOO, MI - The host Western Michigan Broncos opened the game on a 16-4 run and defeated the University at Buffalo, The State University of New York, men's basketball team, 78-68, Saturday afternoon at University Arena. "I give Western a lot of credit today, they were more physical and they were the better team on the floor," said head coach Bobby Hurlley. "Our shots weren't falling for us today and our defense was not at the level it needs to be."

Evans and Moss each finished with a game-high 23 points, as Moss added 11 rebounds for his eighth double-double of the year. They were the only two Bulls to score in double figures.

Rodell Wigginton added eight points and five rebounds, while junior Jarryn Skeete saw action for the first time since Dec. 19 and had four points in the game. Defensively, UB had seven blocked shots, led by three from junior Raheem Johnson.

Western Michigan improved to 10-5 on the year and 1-1 in the MAC as they had four players in double figures led by 21 points from Austin Richie and 17 points from David Brown.

BUFFALO, NY - The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York, men's basketball team placed five in double figures as the Bulls defeated Northern Illinois 82-63, Wednesday night at Alumni Arena. The win improves UB to 11-4 on the year and 2-1 in MAC play.

After allowing over 70 points in three straight games, the Bulls began tonight's game strong defensively, allowing just 21 points in the first half. However, UB struggled to score early on and trailed midway through the first half, 13-12, when they began to get it going. Moss led the Bulls with 18 points, while adding two assists, two blocks and three steals. Skeete finished with 14 points, while Evans had 13 points, four assists and four steals. Bearden added 11 points and six assists.

Wigginton came off the bench after starting the last five games and continued to give great minutes as he finished with 12 points, six rebounds and three steals in 24 minutes. Senior Xavier Ford added six points and eight rebounds off the bench, while fellow senior Will Regan had four points and three blocked shots.

UB got also got solid minutes off the bench from junior Raheem Johnson, who had four points and four rebounds in 18 minutes of action.

The Bulls finished the night with a season-low six turnovers, while forcing NIU into 16 turnovers, 13 of those coming from UB steals. The 13 steals by the Bulls were a season-best as were the nine blocked shots.

BUFFALO, NY - Junior Justin Moss continued to show why he is leading the Mid-American Conference in scoring and rebounding on Saturday afternoon as he set new career highs with 31 points and 15 rebounds, leading the University at Buffalo, The State University of New York, to a 77-68 win over Miami (OH). The victory was UB's second over the RedHawks in less than two weeks and the Bulls are now 12-4 on the year and 3-1 in conference play.

The Bulls struggled from the floor as they snapped a streak of 247 straight games with at least one three pointer made, but UB had the advantage in the paint and at the free throw line and that turned out to be the difference in the game. In fact, 73 of UB's 77 points came from inside the paint or at the free throw line.

Miami (OH) outscored the Bulls in the first half, 32-29, just the fourth time this year that the Bulls trailed at the half. The RedHawks hit six of their eight three pointers in the first half, but they were never able to take more than a five point lead against UB. A tip in from senior Xavier Ford with 1:30 left pulled the Bulls within three and that is how the teams went to the intermission.

In the second half, UB turned up its defensive pressure and began to find the scoring column as they outscored Miami 48-36 over the final 20 minutes of play. The RedHawks scored the first two points of the second half, but then the Bulls held Miami without a field goal for over eight minutes, hitting just two free throws. In that period, UB was able to go on a 16-2 run, which was capped off on a fast break dunk from sophomore Shannon Evans, giving UB a 45-36 lead.

The RedHawks pulled within three at 47-44, but the Bulls went on a quick 8-0 run, which included a steal and a fast break dunk from Ford as well as a thunderous baseline reverse dunk from Moss. The Bulls took their largest lead of the game at 62-50 with 3:08 left as Moss put back a UB miss, but Miami made one last run and got as close as three. However, UB answered each Miami run when it needed to thanks to Moss and Evans who combined to score the final 19 points of the game for the Bulls.

Moss set career highs with 31 points and 15 rebounds today and he became the first player in the nation to have over 30 points and 15 rebounds against a Division I opponent according to ESPN Stats Info. Moss went 10-of-15 from the field and 11-of-15 from the free throw line. He had 15 boards, 12 of those coming on the defensive end. The double-double from Moss was his league-leading ninth of the year.

Evans finished with 17 points, including 9-of-10 from the free throw line, as he added three assists a block and a steal. Ford had 13 points and eight rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench.

With the win, the Bulls improve to 8-0 at Alumni Arena as well as 14-6 on the season and 5-3 in MAC play.

The Golden Flashes scored the first six points of the game, but then senior Xavier Ford ignited a 17-2 run over the next six minutes. Ford and sophomore Shannon Evans combined to score the first 12 points of the game and the Bulls never trailed again. Kent State pulled within four at 19-15, but UB answered with 20-5 run as they ran their first half lead to 39-20 with 3:19 left.

UB got a pair of three pointers from Evans and junior Jarryn Skeete as well as a huge put back dunk from junior Raheem Johnson and another dunk from Ford, who tied his career high with 17 points in the first half alone. Another fast break dunk from Ford gave the Bulls their largest lead of the first half at 45-22. The Bulls took a 45-25 lead into the break.

A pair of three pointers from Ford helped the Bulls score the first eight points of the second half and the Bulls never led by less than 23 over the final 20 minutes of play. UB extended its lead to 30 points following a layup from Evans, which gave the Bulls a 65-35 lead. The 30-point advantage was tied for the largest of the game. The 30-point advantage was UB's second largest lead of the season.

Ford finished with a career-high 25 points, as he became the fourth different UB player to record a 20-point game this year. He went 9-of-14 from the floor, including 3-for-6 from behind the arc. Prior to tonight, Ford had hit just three career three pointers. Ford added nine rebounds, three assists and three steals.

Junior Justin Moss finished the evening with 13 points and nine rebounds, while Evans added 12 points, four assists and a steal. Jarryn Skeete had eight points and two assists, while freshman Lamonte Bearden finished with seven points, three rebounds, three assists and two steals.

Johnson came off the bench and added seven points, three rebounds, while finishing with a career-high four blocked shots. Senior Will Regan added two points, four rebounds, two assists and two blocked shots. Junior Rodell Wigginton finished with four points, four rebounds, four assists and two steals. Also seeing action tonight was Bobby Frasco and Christian Pino, who added two points late in the game.

MUNCIE, IN - The University at Buffalo, the State University of New York, men's basketball team snapped a three-game road losing streak on Wednesday night as the Bulls defeated Ball St., 82-78, at Worthen Arena. The win was just UB's third ever at Ball State in 12 tries. UB is now 15-6 on the year and 6-3 in MAC play, sitting in a five-way tie for first.

The Bulls led for nearly 30 minutes in the contest, but had to overcome an early deficit that began with a Ball State 7-2 run to start the game. The Cardinals continued to hold on to a 23-19 lead when the Bulls went on a 14-1 run to take a nine-point lead. UB got six points during the run from Justin Moss and the final four points from junior Rodell Wigginton. A pair of late free throws from freshman Lamonte Bearden put UB up at the break, 40-30.

UB opened the second half on an 8-3 run to take its largest lead of the game at 48-33, but then the Bulls got into foul trouble as Ball State reached the bonus prior to the first media timeout. The Cardinals crept back within four with 13:00 minutes to go, but UB answered with a 12-4 run to go back up by 12, 63-51 with 9:02 left.

Ball State pulled it back to a one possession game with 3:22 left, but UB got a huge three pointer from Xavier Ford to go back up by six. Xavier Turner hit a three for the Cardinals, but then Shannon Evans answered with a three of his own. UB led by seven with just 25 seconds left, but five straight points from Turner pulled Ball State within two with 10 seconds left. Bearden iced the game for the Bulls though with a pair of free throws as the Bulls held on for the 82-78 win.

Evans led all scorers with 25 points, his seventh 20-point game of the season. Moss added 17 points and nine rebounds, despite playing just 21 minutes due to foul trouble. Wigginton added nine points and five rebounds off the bench, while fellow junior Raheem Johnson had eight points, five rebounds and two blocks. Both were extremely efficient as Wigginton saw just 15 minutes of action and Johnson played 20 minutes.

Bearden finished with seven points, four rebounds, a game-high seven assists and a career-best five steals. Jarryn Skeete added six points and two assists, while seniors Xavier Ford and Will Regan each finished with five points. Regan added two blocks off the bench.

Ball State fell to 7-13 and 2-7 in conference play, but had five players in double figures led by 19 points from freshman Sean Sellers and 17 points from Franko House, before he fouled out.
